12. Pay Accounts and Salaries.

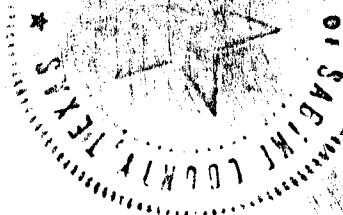
